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Cincinnati Financial Corporation Appoints Manager of Internal Audit

Cincinnati, October 18, 2004—Cincinnati Financial Corporation (Nasdaq:CINF)—Cincinnati Financial Corporation announced today that on October 15, 2004, the audit committee of the board of directors approved the appointment of Donald J. Doyle, Jr., CPCU, AIM, to manage its internal audit department, effective October 18, 2004.
