HAPPY BIRTHDAY KAI KAI AND JIA JIA!

Guests mark pandas' birthdays with giant cakes, new book and lanterns of hope for endangered species;

More than 500 conservation pledges collected ahead of Panda Party 2014

Singapore, **5 September 2014** – Giant pandas Kai Kai and Jia celebrated their birthdays and second anniversary in Singapore in style as over 150 guests joined their birthday bash at River Safari and participated in a Panda Lantern Parade to light the way for the future of the endangered species.

Guest-of-Honour Ms Sim Ann, Minister of State, Ministry of Education & Ministry of Communications and Information, was among the birthday party guests who were given the rare opportunity of touring River Safari at night as they shone lanterns of hope for the future of giant pandas, led by a blazing Chinese dragon dance that trailed across the park.

Male Kai Kai turns seven on 14 September, while his female partner, Jia Jia turned six on 3 September. The pair of pandas arrived in Singapore on 6 September 2012. The birthday duo was treated to birthday 'cakes' specially designed by students of ITE College West.

More than 500 conservation pledges were collected from birthday party guests and members of the public during events held at two of CapitaLand's CapitaMalls, Westgate and ION Orchard, in August. The public pledged their commitment to protect pandas through various ways, from conserving fuel by taking public transport to refraining from using products that may endanger animals.

Wildlife Reserves Singapore Chairman Ms Claire Chiang said, "In the past two years Kai Kai and Jia Jia have brought much joy to visitors at River Safari and as we celebrate their birthdays, we hope to leverage their popularity to initiate education programmes to highlight the threats that pandas face and encourage individuals to take actions to ensure a brighter future for this iconic animal."

The birthday bash also saw the launch of a nursery rhyme book for pre-school children that tells the adventures of the two pandas in Singapore, officiated by Guest-of-Honour Ms Sim Ann. Written by five teachers (Refer to Appendix A), the book is in the Chinese language to help children learn their mother tongue in a fun and engaging manner.

The birthday bash kick-starts festivities happening during Panda Party week from 6-14 September (Refer to Appendix B). Visitors to River Safari can expect a line-up of activities from free guided tours at the Giant Panda Forest to interactive show & tell sessions where they will get the opportunity to feel a panda skull replica and get a whiff of panda poop. Visitors can also plant pledges to help symbolically 'grow' a lush bamboo forest for the bears. Kids can enjoy panda arts and crafts, from face painting to clay modelling activities.

To commemorate this year's Panda Party, River Safari launched a new behind-the-scenes tour called *Panda Rise & Shine* where participants can get up-close with pandas before the park opens, and assist keepers in preparing breakfast for Kai Kai and Jia Jia. This premium experience brings participants to back-of-house areas such as the pandas' dens, kitchen and bamboo storage room.

As part of the festivities during the Panda Party week, visitors can bring home a free panda lantern with purchases at River Safari's retail and F&B outlets. In addition to this birthday treat, visitors can look forward to new panda-licious treats such as Panda Chocolate Mousse, and wild discounts on panda merchandise.

Kai Kai Jia Jia Er Ge

Kai Kai Jia Jia Nursery Rhymes written by five very passionate teacher authors who believe that children learn best through authentic experience that provide emotional connections. They are:

- Mdm Ng Tai Cheen, Principal Master Teacher (Chinese)
- Ms Lim Siew Gek, Retired teacher (Former HOD/Mother Tongue of Ahmad Ibrahim Primary School, Most Inspire Chinese Teacher Award 2002 and President Teachers Award 2005)
- 3. Mdm Teng Mui Kim, Retired teacher(Former Senior teacher of St Andrew's Junior school)
- 4. Mdm Lee Kam Har, Senior Chinese language teacher of ACS (Primary)
- Mdm Yang Fang (Chinese language teacher of Ahmad Ibrahim Primary School)



When the giant pandas came to Singapore, the teacher authors saw great opportunities in using these well-loved bears to excite and engage children in learning Chinese. In their personal capacity and on a pro-bono basis, they worked with Wildlife Reserves Singapore and wrote the two pre-school supplementary readers《凯凯嘉嘉对你说》and 《凯凯嘉嘉儿歌》.

The books are to fulfill the following objectives:

- Engage pre-schoolers in learning Chinese through panda ambassadors Kai Kai and Jia Jia
- Provide authentic learning environment in River Safari and create emotional connections for high level of engagement in children
- Teach values through Kai Kai and Jia Jia
- Teach areas of learning as outlined in the Kindergarten Curriculum Framework, in particular language and literacy, discovery of the world and aesthetics & creative expression

Wildlife Reserves Singapore will be holding workshops to encourage teachers to use the books as a teaching resource. The books will be sold as bulk orders to pre-schools and to members of the public at WRS retail outlets.

On a separate note, the teacher authors have also written story books 《动物园的故事一》,《动物园的故事二》and 《飞禽公园的故事》. These books were published as a joint collaboration between Teachers Network and Wildlife Reserves Singapore. These books serve as supplementary readers, specially tailored for P1 to P4 students.


