Colour to Lives

Park Inn by Radisson Heathrow, in conjunction with locally-based Youth at Risk charities, has been working on their Adding Colour To Lives community programme with youths from Green Corridor.

Add Colour to Lives, a coordinated social action art project, bringing together disaffected and vulnerable young people from local communities across Europe, the Middle East and Africa. arrived in London last week.
