The Company reports its financial results in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). However, management believes that certain non-GAAP financial measures provide users of the Company's financial information with additional useful information. See the tables below for supplemental financial data and corresponding reconciliations to GAAP financial measures. These non-GAAP financial measures should be viewed as supplementing, and not as an alternative or substitute for, the Company's financial results prepared in accordance with GAAP. Certain of the items that may be excluded or included in non-GAAP financial measures may be significant items that could impact the Company's financial position, results of operations and cash flows and should therefore be considered in assessing the Company's actual financial condition and performance. The methods used by the Company to calculate its non-GAAP financial measures may differ significantly from methods used by other companies to compute similar measures. As a result, any non-GAAP financial measures presented herein may not be comparable to similar measures provided by other companies.

- (1) Represents the period-to-period change in net sales from stores in operation throughout the 13 weeks ended May 4, 2013 and the 13 weeks ended April 28, 2012 and all net Internet sales, excluding commissions from departments licensed to third parties.
- (2) Represents the impact on comparable sales growth of including the sales of departments licensed to third parties occurring in stores in operation throughout the 13 weeks ended May 4, 2013 and the 13 weeks ended April 28, 2012 and via the Internet in the calculation. The Company licenses third parties to operate certain departments in its stores and receives commissions from these third parties based on a percentage of their net sales. In its financial statements prepared in conformity with GAAP, the Company includes these commissions (rather than sales of the departments licensed to third parties) in its net sales.

Macy's, Inc. believes that providing comparable sales growth including the impact of growth in comparable sales from departments licensed to third parties supplementally to its results of operations calculated in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles provides useful information to investors. In particular, Macy's, Inc. believes that this supplemental information assists in evaluating the Company's ability to generate sales growth, whether through owned or licensed businesses, on a comparable basis, and in evaluating the impact of changes in the manner in which certain departments are operated (e.g. the conversion in 2013 of most of the Company's previously owned athletic footwear business to licensed Finish Line shops).
