About General Maritime Corporation

General Maritime Corporation is a provider of international seaborne crude oil transportation services principally within the Atlantic basin which includes ports in the Caribbean, South and Central America, the United States, West Africa, the Mediterranean, Europe and the North Sea. We also currently operate tankers in other regions including the Black Sea and Far East. General Maritime Corporation owns and operates a fleet of 42 tankers - 23 Aframax and 19 Suezmax tankers - making it the second largest mid-sized tanker company in the world, with a carrying capacity of approximately 5.1 million dwt.

Upon closing of General Maritime's acquisition of the Soponata Group Assets, which is expected to close by May 2004, the Company's fleet will increase to 51 vessels, including four newbuildings. Including these newbuildings, General Maritime's fleet will consist of 26 Aframax and 25 Suezmax with a carrying capacity of approximately 6.2 million dwt.
