In this context, CSR is pleased to announce two appointments to its Board. John Whybrow and David Tucker have been appointed non-executive directors. It is intended that John Whybrow will become Chairman on listing. He will replace Mike Shone, who will remain a non-executive director.

John Whybrow is currently Chairman of Wolseley and a non-executive director of Dixons and brings significant listed company experience to the Board. Until 2002 he worked in senior roles for Philips Electronics.

David Tucker is a very experienced non-executive director who has worked with a number of listed companies including Birmid and Qualcast PLC, TACE PLC, Sumit PLC and Greycote PLC. He is currently Chairman of the audit committee of Rexam PLC.

Commenting on today's announcement, John Hodgson, CEO of CSR, said:

"I am delighted to welcome John Whybrow and David Tucker to our Board. John and David bring significant listed company and non-executive experience to CSR. These appointments will help to strengthen the Board and put in place the structure to support CSR as it becomes a public company."

CSR commenced shipping its first single chip Bluetooth IC (BlueCore1) in 2000 and in 2003 the third generation, BlueCore3, was released. BlueCore features in over 60 percent of all qualified Bluetooth v1.1 enabled product designs (including end products and modules) with international names such as Apple, Dell, IBM, NEC, Nokia, Panasonic, Sony and Toshiba already using BlueCore in their range of Bluetooth products.

CSR is headquartered in Cambridge, UK, with offices in Richardson, Texas, USA; Tokyo, Japan; Singapore; Seoul, Korea; Taipei, Taiwan and Aalborg, Denmark.

Executive Directors

CEO

John Hodgson has served as CSR's chief executive officer since February 2000. From April 1997 to July 1999, Mr. Hodgson was senior vice president of world wide sales and technology centres at VLSI Technology. From January 1990 to April 1997, Mr. Hodgson served as vice president for world wide sales and marketing and corporate officer at Lucent Microelectronics. Prior to 1990, Mr. Hodgson was a co-founder, director and executive vice president at VTC Inc., a start-up semiconductor company, and prior to that held a number of executive, sales and technical positions at various semiconductor companies, including Fairchild Semiconductor and Texas Instruments. Mr. Hodgson holds a B.Sc. from Leeds University, UK.

Technical Director and Co-Founder

James Collier has served as CSR's chief technical officer since CSR was established in April 1999. Mr. Collier is a co-founder of CSR. Between 1984 and April 1999, Mr. Collier held a number of executive and technical positions at Cambridge Consultants Ltd, where he formed the microelectronics group in 1987. Prior to 1984, Mr. Collier held a number of executive and technical positions at Schlumberger. Mr. Collier holds an M.A. in physics from Oxford University, UK.

Sales Director and Co-Founder

Glenn Collinson has served as CSR's executive sales director since August 2002. Between CSR's establishment in April 1999 and August 2002, Mr. Collinson was marketing director at CSR. Mr. Collinson is a co-founder of CSR. John Whybrow joined CSR as a non-executive director in December 2003 and it is intended that he will become Chairman on listing. Mr. Whybrow is Chairman of Wolseley plc, having been a non-executive Director since 1999. He is also non-executive director of Dixons Group plc. A large part of Mr. Whybrow's career has been with Philips Electronics where he held a number of senior roles including Chairman and Managing Director of Philips Electronics UK Ltd before moving to Holland in 1995 as President and CEO of Philips Lighting becoming Executive Vice President and member of the board of Management in 1998. In April 2002 Mr. Whybrow returned to the UK, leaving Philips to pursue a wider portfolio of activities. Mr Whybrow is a graduate of the Imperial College, London and has an MBA from Manchester Business School.

Non-Executive Director

David Tucker

David Tucker joined CSR as a non-executive director in January 2004. After nineteen years as an investment manager with M&G unit trusts, Mr Tucker retired as deputy managing director in 1988. Since then he has been a non-executive director of a number of listed companies. He is currently chairman of Britannic Smaller Companies Trust and Edinburgh UK Tracker Trust and a non-executive director of Rexam PLC where he chairs the audit committee. He is also a trustee of the Mineworkers' Pension Scheme and a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.
