Funding of up to \$10,000 available to help build stronger communities

ANZ and the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) today announced that applications for this year's *Seeds of Renewal* grants are now open.

This year grants will be given to assist small rural and regional communities work towards a more sustainable future. Projects that create community well being, support volunteer initiatives at a local level or diversify local economies could be eligible for up to \$10,000 through the program.

Commenting on the program, FRRR Chief Executive Officer, Ms Sylvia Admans said: "Seeds of Renewal grants have collectively made a real difference to hundreds of rural communities across Australia. The grants are designed to help communities help themselves, so I would encourage community organisations to seek support from this highly effective program."

Seeds of Renewal is funded by ANZ and independently administered by the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR).

ANZ Managing Director for Regional, Rural and Small Business Banking, Mr Rob Goudswaard said: "Seeds of Renewal is an important part of ANZ's commitment to making a difference in the communities where we live and work. This year the grants will help small communities with projects that support renewal and sustain them long into the future."

Applications will be accepted from not-for-profit organisations with an ABN in communities with a population of 15,000 people or less.

Since its inception in 2003, Seeds of Renewal has provided small grants to the overall value of more than \$1.6 million to approximately 380 community projects including:

- A raw water line for recreational water use in the Baralaba community in Queensland
- An information and support network for refugee women living in the Lismore region
- The opening of a fuel outlet in Gulargambone, New South Wales
- An information kiosk at the Hume Freeway roadhouse to promote tourism and business opportunities in the local area
- A 5,000 gallon water tank for kindergarten in Dunkeld, Victoria to capture rainwater
- A recording and filming studio for the Kimba local community in South Australia.

Seeds of Renewal

- Seeds of Renewal is an ANZ-funded rural and regional grants program for community projects in small towns.
- Seeds of Renewal is independently administered by the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR).
- By the end of this year, Seeds of Renewal will have granted almost \$2 million to around 500 community projects in small towns since its inception in 2003.
- Applications for 2008 are now open and will close at 5.00pm on 14 May 2008.
- The grants pool for the 2008 program totals \$450,000 with a maximum of \$10,000 per project.
- Applications are accepted from not-for-profit organisations with an ABN in communities with population of 15,000 people or less, or for community based responses to water sustainability issues.
