

JCPENNEY REPORTS MAY SALES

PLANO, **Texas**, **June 5**, **2008** -- J. C. Penney Company, Inc. (NYSE:JCP) comparable store sales decreased 4.4 percent for the four weeks ended May 31, 2008, in line with guidance for sales to decrease mid-single digits and compared to a 0.9 percent decrease last year. Total sales in May decreased 2.4 percent.

The top performing merchandise divisions during the month were in family footwear and women's accessories, while fine jewelry and most home categories continued to experience weaker sales. Geographically, the best performing region of the country was the northwest.
