Nick A. Khouri, 42, serves as vice president and treasurer of both Detroit Edison, an electric utility serving 2.1 million customers in Southeastern Michigan, and its parent company, DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide. As vice president and treasurer, he is responsible for all banking relationships, cash management, corporate finance and risk management.

Khouri joined DTE Energy and Detroit Edison in 1999 as manager, Finance, and assistant treasurer, where he developed financial policy issues and was responsible for long-term financial strategies for DTE Energy Co.

Prior to joining the energy company, Khouri served as vice president of Lansing, Mich.-based Public Sector Consultants Inc. from 1997 to 1999. In this capacity, he concentrated in the areas of financial management, economic development, public infrastructure investment, state and local tax policy, and municipal debt markets. Khouri also served as the chief deputy treasurer for the state of Michigan from 1991 to 1997. Prior to joining the state treasury, Khouri was the chief economist for the Senate Fiscal Agency, a nonpartisan research agency of the Michigan Senate. He also served as an analyst in the macro-economic division of the U.S. Congressional Budget Office in Wash. D.C., and as an economist with the Bureau of Economic Analysis, U.S. Department of Commerce in Wash. D.C.

Khouri is a past chairman of the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority and a former member of the Michigan State Housing Development Authority and the Michigan Hospital Finance Authority. In 1993, he was a member of Michigan Gov. John Engler's Task Force on Educational Reform, with responsibility for developing the Governor's recommendation for school financing alternatives.

Khouri earned a bachelor of arts degree in economics at The University of Michigan and a master's degree in economics at Michigan State University. His professional affiliations include the American Economic Association and the National Tax Association. He is a former member of the Government Finance Officers Association, and the State Debt Issuers/National Association of State Treasurers.
