Ron A. May, 49, is senior vice president at Detroit Edison, an electric utility serving 2.1 million customers in Southeastern Michigan. May is responsible for distribution activities of DTE Energy Distribution, one of three major business units of DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide.

May joined Detroit Edison in 1984 as director of planning and control of nuclear administration at the company's nuclear power plant, Fermi 2. He held a series of increasingly responsible positions, including manager of service center operations; assistant vice president, energy delivery; and vice president, energy distribution. Earlier in his career, he was vice president and operations manager for Project Management Associates, working on the Fermi 2 construction project. From 1974 to 1981, he worked for Townsend and Bottum, Inc. on several projects related to Detroit Edison's St. Clair Power Plant.

May earned a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering at the University of Michigan, and associate of science and associate of business administration degrees from St. Clair County Community College.

May serves as a member of the board of directors, as well as president, of Crossroads for Youth, Inc. He also currently serves on the board of directors of Warren Conner Development Coalition. He was the past president of the Business Consortium for the Arts, City of Southfield.
